



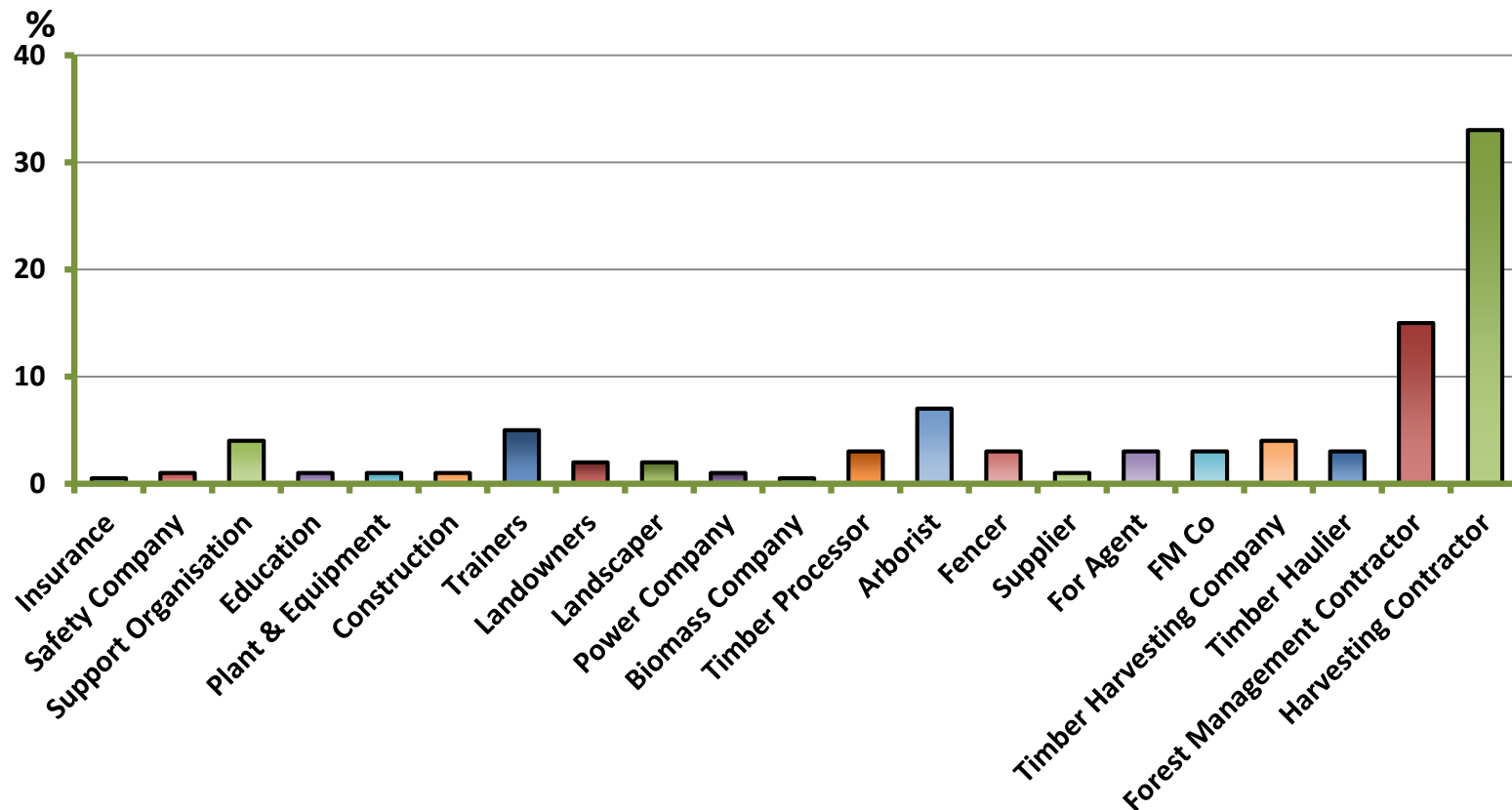

FISA Membership by type

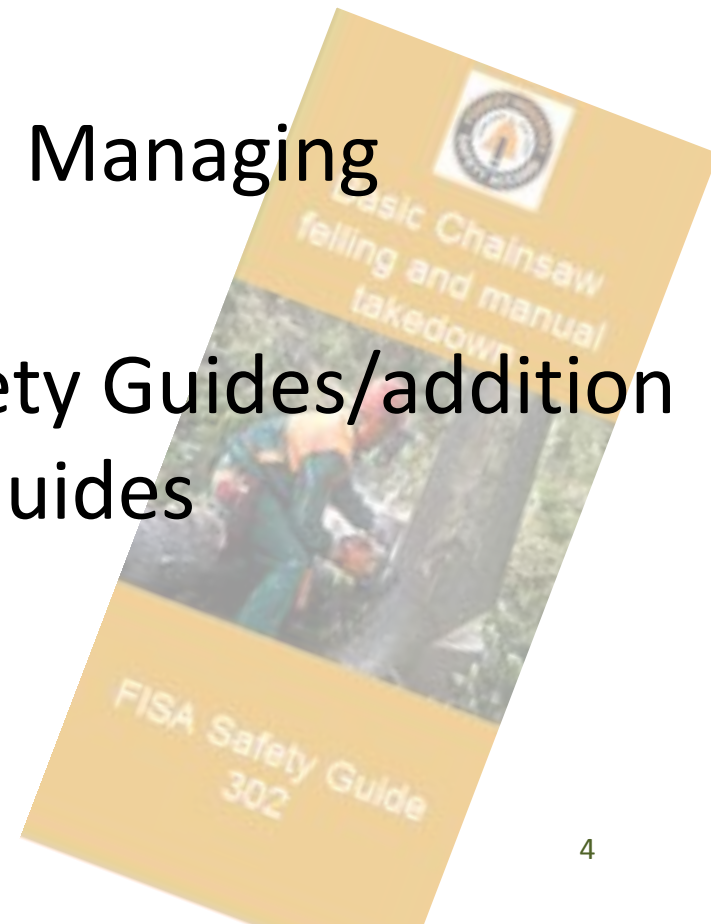
